This year my son, who is a Junior in High School, is taking college classes through Colorado Early College (CEC). He has used captioning to access remote meetings with advisors and counselors. Thank you <u>T-mobile's provision of RCC for the captioning!</u>

He is taking online and remote classes through Aims Community College. Their Disability Access Services office has been great about communicating with him and providing interpreters and transcripts for his classes. They told him there were several types of captioning/notetaking platforms he could potentially use. He used his self advocacy skills to ask for samples and picked the one he thought would be best for the start of the semester. On day one of his classes, interpreters and captioning was there, helpful, and he participated in his classes. He is also taking one class on campus at FRCC and they have been great about discussing options and services that he might need as well.

We talk so often at the beginning stages of this journey about access and communication. I just want to share that while the advocacy continues, it has been encouraging to see my 17 year old take more of the lead and navigate the services and accommodations that he wants.

HELPING OTHERS

This summer, my family and I had the opportunity to travel to Kenya for almost three weeks. We spent the first week doing volunteer work in a small county called Bomet. While my parents were working at Tenwek Hospital, my brother and I did some work around the community. On our second day in Bomet, we traveled to a local village to build a mud hut for a mentally ill man who had recently lost his wife. All of the side roads in Kenya aren't paved, so the ride had us bouncing all over the place. When we arrived at the village, the wood framework of the hut was already in place. Since none of the villagers spoke English, we just followed along with what they were doing and started to collect water from a small pond and pour it on the dirt surrounding the hut. After taking off our shoes, we started to walk around in the mud to make it smooth enough to layer onto the hut. Once the mud was ready, the fun began. At first, I was a little hesitant to get my hands dirty because I wouldn't be able to adjust my hearing aids if I needed to, but my mom put wet wipes in my backpack just in case I needed to wipe my hands. Little by little, we proceeded to pick up the mud and lay it in the cracks between the wood.

People were working from both the inside and outside of the hut, and once the first layer was complete, we were able to make the second layer by throwing little balls of mud onto the hut. While we took a little break during lunchtime to have some chai, all the kids from a nearby school came and helped to smooth out the final layer of mud. Before heading back, we went to a church a couple minutes from the village to have a late lunch of rice and beans. I can't tell you how grateful I am to have gotten this eye-opening opportunity to experience life as a villager in Kenya - and all the rest of the fun this trip held!
